Chronology

1521: Birth of Antoine Caron in Beauvais where he receives initial training

1541: Works on the Ulysses Gallery at the Château de Fontainebleau

1550: Present at Anet

7 juin 1559: Documented as painter of Diane de Poitiers

Avant 1559: Nicolas Houel plans his French History of our Age

1561: The archives mention Caron in Paris, living on the rue Saint-Martin; he is

among the artists hired for the royal entrance of Charles IX to Paris

1561-1570: The Story of Queen Artemisia of the apothecary Nicolas Houel

1566: The Massacres of the Triumvirate, the only work signed and dated by Caron

1568-1573: Designs for the tapestries for the Paris church of Saint-Jacques-la-Boucherie

1573: Caron is responsible for the paintings for the Royal entrance to Paris of the Prince Henri de Valois, elected King of Poland

1573-1574: Drawings connected to the Valois Tapestries

Late 1570s: The Valois Tapestries is woven in Brussels

1581: Wedding of the Duc de Joyeuse; Henri III commissions Caron to create the altarpiece of the Ordre du Saint-Esprit

1588: Caron creates the designs for the decoration of the chapel of the Château de Villeroy made by Mathieu Jacquet and Gervais Jouens

1596: Start of the work on the Belle Cheminée at Fontainebleau

1597-1599: Caron creates the drawings to illustrate *Philostratus*

1599: Death of Caron; Engraved Portrait of Caron

1600: Publication of the Equestrian Portrait of Henri IV after Caron

1601: Weaving of the *Story of Artemisia* tapestry series starts; *The Crucifixion* after Caron

1614: illustrated edition of Philostratus

1515-1547: Reign of François I

1532: Primaticcio in France

1547-1559: Reign of Henri II

1552: Niccolò dell'Abate in France

1559-1560: Reign of François II

1560-1563: Regency of Catherine de Medici

1561-1574: Reign of Charles IX
